OLEKSANDR KRYVOSHEYA'S RESILIENCE HELP PROVIDED

Amidst the ravages of Spring 2022 in Kyiv oblast, Oleksandr Kryvosheya's farm, «Soloviine», bore the brunt of artillery and explosions, incurring losses over UAH 1.3 million. WRRU's intervention brought a beacon of hope: a new tractor, pivotal for winter crop planting. Oleksandr's journey continues with WRRU's ongoing support and expert soil fertility consultation for his potato and carrot crops.





IRYNA SHEVCHENKO'S REBIRTH HELP PROVIDED

The village of Borodianka faced occupation in Spring 2022. Amidst this turmoil, Iryna Shevchenko's barn was decimated by a rocket, sparing only eight cows. WRRU responded with compassion, transforming her barn into a functional house complete with a summer kitchen and a vital milk refrigerator, offering a new beginning.





ALLA KOKOSHA'S NEW DAWN HELP PROVIDED

In the wake of Kyiv's attempted capture, Alla Kokosha's family lost everything – their home, storage, and garage were reduced to rubble. Cast into despair, WRRU brought light, meticulously rebuilding Alla's house, restoring shelter and hope to her family of four.





ACHIEVEME

JULIA KOVALENKO'S RECOVERY HELP PROVIDED

Julia Kovalenko's family in Kherson oblast witnessed their farm's heart - the storage barn - shattered by relentless shelling.

Operating over 150 hectares, this loss was crippling. WRRU's efforts resurrected the warehouse, empowering the family to renew their farming life post-demining.





AHAVEN FOR HOPE HELP PROVIDED

An orphanage near a military base in Kyiv oblast, sheltering 60 children, including 30 infants, reached out to WRRU for a critical need — a bomb shelter. Collaboratively, WRRU, a local farmer, and a private company crafted a sanctuary: a robust bomb shelter with a ventilation system and a protective concrete structure, ensuring safety and peace.





NATALIA MELNYCHENKO'S CHOICE OF STRENGTH HELP PROVIDED

Natalia Melnychenko's family in Kherson oblast endured nine months under occupation. Post-liberation, they faced a devastated home and destroyed machinery. Prioritizing her family's agricultural future over immediate housing needs, Natalia chose a truck to revive their farming. WRRU honored her resilience, aiding in the purchase of this essential vehicle for fieldwork.





AID RECIPIENTS

OLEKSANDR ADAMENKO'S LOST HARVEST HELP NEEDED

Oleksandr Adamenko, a 57-year-old farmer from Kherson oblast, faced devastating losses during the occupation. His farm was stripped of essential tools, from seeders to solar batteries, and his warehouse, with the previous year's yield, was burned to ashes. The family home stands bare, lacking windows, doors, and a damaged roof. WRRU plans to resurrect his 700 m² warehouse, a critical step for Oleksandr to reclaim his farming life and secure future harvests.





AID RECIPIENTS

OLEKSANDR DONCHENKO'S SHELTER OF HOPE HELP NEEDED



In the heart of Kherson oblast, Oleksandr Donchenko's warehouse, an integral part of his farming existence, was ravaged by shelling debris. With a damaged roof and façade, the structure stands in dire need of reconstruction. WRRU aims to restore this vital facility, enabling Oleksandr to continue his agricultural pursuits effectively and sustain his livelihood.





AIDRECIPIENTS

ANDRII MATVIJENKO'S FIGHT FOR REBUILDING HELP LEDED

The Matvienko family's world was shattered on September 9th, 2022, when a Russian tank unleashed havoc in their yard in Izium village, Kharkiv oblast. The catastrophic event destroyed their barn, equipment, garage, two houses, and claimed the lives of their livestock. Now, Andrii, reliant on the meager income from milk sales, faces the harsh reality of insufficient funds for reconstruction. With winter looming, WRRU's immediate goal is to rebuild their home, providing shelter and a beacon of hope in these trying times.

MUCH MORE ARE STILL IN NEED

FAO'S REPORT ON SMALL-SCALE FARMERS

The war has led to a significant decline in Ukraine's small-scale farming, with losses exceeding USD 3.85 billion. This severe impact, confirmed by a FAO survey of 1,927 producers, includes an 8% decrease in small-scale farming operations due to challenges like farm closures, loss of farmland control, and the death of farm owners.





UKRAINE'S AGRICULTURAL LOSSES

Only the first eight months of war inflicted direct losses of \$6.6 billion on Ukrainian agribusiness, 23% of the sector's total value, as reported by the Kyiv School of Economics (KSE) Agrocenter. Taken the Ukraine's pre-war capability to feed up to 600 mln by the end of last year 138 000 000 lost their food supply.

WRRU doesn't give off cash. Instead we provide the services of rebuilding/repurchasing what they owned before the russians came. WRRU doesn't upgrade. The people get back the very same ownership, which was ruthlessly taken from them by russian fascist.




EDUCATIONA SUPPORT


We have held a number of educational agricultural events under the auspices of «World to Rebuild Rural Ukraine» charity fundraising project.
